ST. DUNSTAN'S—100 YEARS

As a way of marking the centennial of our Basilica, our historical sketches continue. Thanks to Fr. Art O'Shea for these.

With the arrival of young Bishop Henry O'Leary in May of 1913, real planning for the new cathedral got underway. Meanwhile, the modest former Zion church nearby was temporarily serving the liturgical needs of the parish. Fortunately, the large cathedral basement was relatively unharmed by the fire and by Christmas of 1914 this area was opened to serve as regular church while the great upstairs would be completed gradually with young John Hunter as architect. During this quiet period at the church other important events were happening within the cathedral parish.

In 1914 the new St. Vincent's Orphanage on the edge of town opened under the leadership of the Grey Nuns of Quebec. This new building in brick stood on a 75-acre farm with its other buildings. In 1916 a new religious order of women was founded, the Sisters of St. Martha of P.E. I. To them Mary Monaghan of Charlottetown donated a large house and 50 acres of prime land that soon became their mother house site. As well, St. Dunstan's College in 1917 was raised to the dignity of a university. By 1917, however, the push was finally on to complete the grand cathedral within the next two years which called for much activity and delicate planning to meet that deadline.
